

## Assistant Professor, Sociocultural Anthropologist of Human Migration

The Department of Anthropology at the University of California, Santa Barbara, invites applications for a sociocultural anthropologist specializing in the study of human migration, beginning July 1, 2020. The appointment is a tenure-track position at the rank of Assistant Professor. We seek a scholar whose research makes innovative contributions to the understanding of human migration and related flows (e.g., technology, finance, commodities, waste, ideas, language, other species), emphasizing the cultural, community, and socio-material assemblages that emerge in the context of migration. An emphasis in one or more of the following areas would be an asset: climate change, borderlands, diasporas, violence and security, gender and sexuality, labor and class, critical disability studies, critical race theory, queer theory, religion, medical anthropology. Geographical focus is open. The minimum requirement to be considered an applicant is the completion of all requirements for a PhD except the dissertation (ABD status) in Anthropology or a closely related field at the time of application. A research specialization in the anthropological study of migration, based on a strong record of ethnographic fieldwork and rigorous theoretical grounding, is required. The ideal candidate will engage with critical questions in anthropology and demonstrate attention to the broader context of anthropological research in contemporary society. Applied, multi-modal, transdisciplinary, experimental, and/or activist approaches are welcome. The successful candidate will be expected to teach a wide array of courses, including large introductory surveys, upper-division undergraduate courses, and advanced graduate seminars, and contribute to graduate and undergraduate mentorship. The department is especially interested in candidates who are committed to promoting a climate that values diversity and inclusion and can contribute to the excellence of the academic community through research, teaching, and service, as appropriate to the position.
